Rules of Order of the Convention.

1. The daily sessions of the Convention shall be opened with Divine service.
2. When the President takes the chair, no member shall continue standing or shall afterwards stand up, unless to address the chair.
3. When the President shall have taken the chair, the Minutes of the preceding day shall be read.
4. During the Convention the following named Committees shall be appointed by the Bishop:
 - I. On Admission of New Parishes and Lay Credentials.
 - II. On Constitution and Canons.
 - III. On Raising Funds for the Endowment of the Episcopate.
 - IV. On Dispatch of Business.
 - V. On the State of the Church.
5. All Committees shall be appointed by the President, unless otherwise ordered.
6. All resolutions shall be reduced to writing, presented to the Secretary, and read by him. A resolution that is not a part of a committee report may be introduced only at the time indicated in the Order of Business. All resolutions, except those forming a part of a committee report, shall be referred immediately after introduction without debate to a special or standing committee.
7. When any member is about to speak, or deliver any matter to the House, he shall, with due respect, address himself to the President, confining himself strictly to the point in debate.
8. Any member shall not absent himself from the service of the House unless he have leave or be unable to attend.
9. A member, other than the Chairman of a committee whose report is under consideration, shall not speak more than twice in the same debate, nor longer than ten minutes at a time, without leave of the House.
10. Any member of the House may call for a vote by Ayes or Nays.
11. When a question has once been determined it shall stand as the judgment of the House, and shall not again be drawn into debate, except on motion for reconsideration, which must be made by a member who had previously voted in the majority, and all motions to reconsider must be made on the day the vote is taken, or on the next succeeding day.

12. When a question is under consideration, a motion shall not be received, except to lay it upon the table, to postpone to a certain time, to postpone it indefinitely, to commit it, to divide it or amend it, and motions for any of these purposes shall have precedence in the order herein named. If a motion to lay an amendment on the table be carried, the matter before the House shall be proceeded with as if no such amendment had been offered. The motions to lay upon the table and to adjourn shall be decided without debate. The motion to adjourn shall always be in order. No motion shall be considered before it is seconded.

13. Debate shall not be allowed upon a motion to refer any motion or resolution to a committee, or upon a motion to recommit any motion or resolution to a committee, or upon a motion to recall any motion or resolution from a committee, or upon a motion to suspend the rules of order; but the member who offers an undebatable motion may speak five minutes for the purpose of explaining its object.

14. All amendments may be considered in the order in which they are moved. When a proposed amendment is under consideration, a motion to amend the same may be made. An after-amendment to such second amendment shall not be in order; but when an amendment to an amendment is under consideration, a substitute to the whole matter may be received. A proposition different from the one under consideration shall not be received under color of an amendment or substitute.

15. Every member who may be in the House when any question is put shall, in division, be counted unless he be excused by the Convention.

16. All questions of order shall be decided in the first instance by the Chair, without debate; an appeal, however, may be made from his decision to the Convention by any member of the same.

17. The Secretary may employ one or more pages, not exceeding three, to act as messengers during the sessions of the Convention.

18. The reports of all Committees shall be in writing, and shall be received, of course, without motion for acceptance, unless recommit-
ted by a vote of the House. All reports recommending or requiring any action or expression of opinion by the House shall be accompanied by a resolution for the action of the House thereon. All annual reports shall be received and filed by the Secretary as presented before or during the Convention, and may be called up on motion to be read and considered at any time during the Convention.

19. The names of the movers of resolutions shall appear in the minutes of the Convention.

20. All motions and resolutions requiring reference shall be referred as far as possible, to the Standing Committees.

21. In the case of an election by ballot requiring a concurrent majority of both Orders, the balloting shall be conducted in the following manner: the Tellers appointed to receive the vote of each Order shall take their stand near the platform at the same time, the Tellers for the Laity by the Secretary's table, and the Tellers for the Clergy in a place apart from them. The roll of the Clergy shall be called by the Secretary, and they shall come forward at the calling of their names and deposit their ballots; the roll of the Lay Delegates

shall then be called by the Secretary, and they shall come forward at the calling of their names and deposit their ballots; and no persons whose names do not appear on either roll shall be allowed to vote. Whenever more than the canonical number to be elected by either Order are found to have received such majority of votes, the number required by Canon having the highest number of votes shall be declared duly elected.

MINUTES

Christ Church Cathedral, Saint Louis,
Tuesday, February 8, 1938.

The Clergy and Lay Delegates to the Ninety-ninth Annual Convention of the Diocese of Missouri assembled in the Dean Schuyler Memorial Auditorium of the Bishop Tuttle Memorial on Tuesday, February 8, 1938, at 4 p.m., with the Bishop in the Chair.

The Secretary of the Diocese called the roll of the Clergy of the Diocese. Of the thirty-seven who were entitled to vote, eighteen were present.

The Secretary presented the report of the Committee on the Admission of New Parishes and Lay Credentials. (See Page 13.)

The Secretary called the roll of the thirty-seven Parishes and Missions of the Diocese which were entitled to representation in the Convention. Delegates from twenty-two were present.

A quorum being present, the Bishop declared the Convention duly convened.

The Secretary introduced Resolution No. 1, which was adopted as follows:

Resolution No. 1.

RESOLVED, That the Rules of Order of the last Convention be adopted for this Convention.

The Secretary introduced Resolution No. 2, which was adopted as follows:

Resolution No. 2.

RESOLVED, That at the close of this afternoon's session this Convention shall adjourn to meet at 7:30 o'clock this evening, and at the close of this evening's session this Convention shall adjourn to meet at 10 o'clock Wednesday forenoon.

The Rev. C. E. Remick was elected Secretary of the Convention and Diocese.

The Rev. L. H. Nugent was appointed a Committee of One on the Dispatch of Business.

By authority of the Convention, the Bishop appointed the following named Nominating Committee:

The Secretary read the report of the Church Pension Fund, which was received and filed.

The Rev. Dr. Block presented his report as Chairman of the Department of Missions and Church Extension, which was received and filed.

The Rev. Mr. Heim presented his report as Chairman of the Department of Religious Education, which was received and filed.

The Rev. Mr. Poindexter presented the report of The Foreword published by the Department of Publicity, which was received and filed. (Appendix No. 10.)

The Rev. Mr. Woolfall, as Chairman of the Field Department, made an oral report.

Mrs. Messick presented her report as President of the Board of Managers of the Episcopal Home for Children, which was received and filed.

Canon George presented his report as Superintendent of the Episcopal Mission to City Institutions, which was received and filed. (Appendix 11.)

Miss Lois Phillips presented a supplementary report for the Episcopal Mission to City Institutions, which was received and filed.

Mrs. John F. Shepley presented her report as President of the City Mission Society, which was received and filed.

Mrs. Harold E. Woodward presented her report as President of the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary, which was received and filed.

The Rev. Dr. Block presented his report as Chairman of the Board of Examining Chaplains, which was received and filed. (Appendix 12.)

The Rev. Father Bayne presented his report as Chairman of the Department of Christian Social Service, which was received and filed.

The Rev. Mr. Putney made an oral report as Superintendent of St. Luke's Hospital.

The Rev. Mr. Nugent introduced Resolution No. 3, which was referred to the Committee on Constitution and Canons, as follows:

Resolution No. 3.

RESOLVED, That Canon 22 be amended by striking out paragraphs three and four in Section 2; and by adding between paragraphs five and six the following paragraph:

“To observe and enforce, as far as possible, the governing rules and procedures adopted by the Trustees in the management of the Church Pension Fund”;

AND FURTHER, That the paragraphs, as amended in Section 2, be renumbered, so that said Section 2, as amended, shall read as follows:

SEC. 2. The Bishop shall appoint annually, a Committee on the Church Pension Fund, to consist of two clergymen and three laymen. The duties of the Committee shall be as follows:

First. To furnish annually to the Church Pension Fund a list of the clergy canonically resident in this Diocese, and of the clergy canonically resident in other dioceses or missionary districts licensed to officiate in this Diocese, with a statement of the stipends received by each of said clergymen from any parish or mission in this Diocese or other organization in this Diocese, which either is subject to this Convention, or being engaged in religious or charitable work as a Church institution elects to come into the Church Pension Fund.

Second. To receive from the Church Pension Fund annually a statement of the premiums necessary to be paid by each of the said parishes, missions, or other organizations in order that the clergymen in receipt of stipends from them may be entitled respectively to pensions.

Third. To inform the Church Pension Fund from time to time of the clergy and the widows and minor orphans of clergy who may be entitled, in respect of this Diocese, to receive pensions from the Church Pension Fund.

Fourth. To observe and enforce, as far as possible, the governing rules and procedures adopted by the Trustees in the management of the Church Pension Fund.

Fifth. In general, to inform the clergy and laity of the Diocese of the pension system created by the General Convention, and committed by it to the operation of the Church Pension Fund, whereby the clergy of the Church are assured of pensions, as of right, to themselves in the event of old age or disability, and in the event of death, to their widows and minor orphans, and to do all things that may be necessary or advisable in the premises, to the end that the moneys necessary to be paid by the parishes, missions, and other ecclesiastical organizations may be fully and systematically paid.

The Rev. Dr. Guy E. Shipler, Editor of the Churchman, addressed the Convention.

The Convention took a recess until 7:30 p.m.

The Bishop addressed the Convention on the work in the Diocese.

Addresses also were made by the Rev. Wilbur Ruggles, the Rev. William H. Kirk, Mr. Arthur Steidemann and Dean Sweet.

Motion pictures on the Missionary work in the Diocese were shown.

After a prayer and benediction by the Bishop, the Convention adjourned under the rules.

SECOND DAY

Christ Church Cathedral, Saint Louis,

Wednesday, February 9, 1938.

The Holy Communion was celebrated at 9 a.m. by the Bishop assisted by Cathedral Clergy.

The Convention was called to order at 10 o'clock in the Schuyler Memorial Auditorium of the Bishop Tuttle Memorial.

The Minutes of the First Day were read and approved.

Mr. C. H. Poindexter, Chairman of the Finance Department of the Diocesan Council made an oral report and called up the report of the Diocesan Council for consideration.

By request of Mr. Poindexter the Secretary introduced Resolutions Nos. 4, 5 and 6, which were adopted as follows:

Resolution No. 4.

RESOLVED, in accordance with the recommendation of the Diocesan Council (Appendix No. 9), that the schedule of Assessments for the Diocesan Fund (Appendix No. 9-B), amounting to \$16,238.95, be adopted; and that the proceeds therefrom, together with all additional money received for this Fund by the Treasurer, be appropriated to pay the Diocesan Expense Budget for 1938, amounting to \$16,237.50 (Appendix No. 9-A).

Resolution No. 5.

RESOLVED, in accordance with the recommendation of the Diocesan Council, that the schedule of Apportionments for the Church Program Fund (Appendix No. 9-D), amounting to \$30,642.40, be adopted; and that the proceeds therefrom, together with all additional money received for this Fund by the Treasurer, be appropriated to pay the Diocesan Church Program Budget for 1938 (Appendix No. 9-C), amounting to \$20,421.50, and to pay the Expectancy of \$11,000.00 to the Treasurer of the National Council.

Resolution No. 6.

RESOLVED, in accordance with the recommendation of the Diocesan Council, that all income received from the Diocesan Extension and Maintenance Trust, together with all other income received for the same purpose, be appropriated to pay the Diocesan Extension and Maintenance Budget for 1938, amounting to \$5,785.75 (Appendix No. 9-E).

Mrs. Dwight Currie presented her report as President of the Girls' Friendly Society, which was received and filed.

Dean Sweet, as Chairman of the Committee on the State of the Church, made a preliminary oral report.

Mr. Ethan A. H. Shepley as a member of the above named Committee, made an oral report, and introduced Resolution No. 7, which was adopted as follows:

Resolution No. 7.

WHEREAS, the Church Pension Fund, under its charter, provides benefits only for ordained clergymen; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Social Security Act does not include in its benefits provision for the lay workers of the Church, and

WHEREAS, the General Convention of 1937 has strongly recommended to the Dioceses, parishes, missions, and other institutions of the Church that they give immediate consideration to the purchase of retirement contracts to provide benefits for all lay employees, and has called attention to the retirement policies available for this purpose with the Church Life Insurance Corporation, and other insurance companies, be it hereby

RESOLVED, That this Convention urges upon the Parishes, Missions, and other institutions of the Diocese that they do give such immediate consideration to the purchase of retirement contracts for their lay employees, and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Convention heartily endorses the principle inherent in this proposal. That a Committee be appointed by the Bishop to canvass the whole matter and report to the Diocesan Council for consideration and recommendation to the several Parishes.

The Rev. Dr. Block, a member of the above named Committee, made an oral report on the action of the General Convention in regard to Church Unity, and introduced Resolution No. 8, which was adopted as follows:

Resolution No. 8.

RESOLVED, That the Diocese of Missouri appoint a Commission on approaches to unity with the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A. and other communions as may be deemed advisable and invite representatives of these bodies to meet for conversations designed to establish closer relations between the churches in the spirit of the Resolution passed by our recent General Convention.

Mr. J. K. Stribling, a member of the above named Committee, made an oral report on the proceedings of the General Convention.

Dean Sweet made an address on the matter of Relief in China, and on his motion it was recommended that a special offering be taken for that purpose in all the Parishes and Missions in the Diocese on the third Sunday in Lent.

The Rev. Father Bayne, as Chairman of the Department of Christian Social Service, addressed the Convention on the subject of Rural Work in the Diocese, and on his motion the Bishop was requested to appoint a commission to consider this subject.

The Bishop read the following statement:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of Canon 17 I have changed St. Paul's Parish, Mexico, to the status of a Mission, for the reason that said Parish has failed for two successive years to make its annual report to the Diocesan Convention and during the same period has failed to elect a Vestry, and I request this Convention to approve this change of status.

The Secretary introduced Resolution No. 9, which was adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 9.

RESOLVED, That this Convention approves the action of the Bishop in changing St. Paul's Parish, Mexico, to the status of a Mission under the provisions of Section 2, Canon 17; and that this Convention, acting under Section 3 of said Canon 17, hereby authorizes and directs the corporation, persons, or trustees holding title to any real estate or personal property for the benefit of said Parish, to convey, forthwith, all such real estate and personal property to the Parochial Trust Fund of the Diocese of Missouri, to be held and disposed of for the use and benefit of said Mission under the direction of the Diocesan Council.

The Secretary introduced Resolution No. 10, which was adopted by the unanimous vote of each Order, voting separately, as follows:

Resolution No. 10.

RESOLVED, That Resolution No. 7 of the Ninety-eighth Convention (concerning Article III of the Constitution of this Diocese), which was approved at that Convention, be finally adopted, as follows:

RESOLVED, That Article III of the Constitution of the Diocese of Missouri be repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Article be enacted, to be entitled "Article III., Of the Annual Convention," viz.:

The Convention of the Church of this Diocese shall assemble annually, on the first Tuesday in February, at such place as shall have been appointed by the preceding Annual Convention; but for sufficient cause the ecclesiastical authority of the Diocese shall have power to change the time or place, or both; provided, however, that at least ten days' notice of such change shall be given to every Vestry, and to the Minister in charge of every Parish and Mission in the Diocese.

The Rev. Mr. Hohenschild introduced Resolution No. 11, which was adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 11.

WHEREAS, in view of the fact that great numbers of persons of the City of St. Louis are on relief and dependent for food, heat and shelter, it has come to our attention that rents have not been paid for these persons since September, 1937. When the Legislature of Missouri increased the sales tax to 2% a year ago, we were informed that it would adequately care for those on relief. The failure to pay rent has caused mental anxiety and great hardships to these people, and it is also unfair to expect landlords to carry this burden. The landlords are expected to pay taxes, supply water and care for public improvements. Failure to pay rents has created a most serious situation in the City for property owners. In many cases property owners have been most generous and do not wish to dispossess persons on relief, but they are entitled to their rent and the Relief Agency should assume this responsibility.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That it be the sense of this Convention to appeal to the Governor of Missouri, the Mayor of the City of St. Louis, and to the Social Security Commission of the State of Missouri, to take immediate steps to pay rent for persons on relief and to eliminate this unfair practice and injustice worked upon recipients of relief and to property owners in the City of St. Louis.

The Bishop led the Convention in Noonday Prayers.

The Rev. Dr. Block made an oral report on the subject of Evangelism, and introduced Resolution No. 12, which was adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 12.

RESOLVED, That the Chairman appoint a Diocesan Commission on Evangelism consisting of six clergymen, six laymen and six laywomen to institute as soon as may be a carefully planned program for Evangelistic effort covering the entire Diocese and beginning in the Fall of 1938; RESOLVED FURTHER, That this Convention hereby calls on all of our people, clerical and lay, to assist in any way within their power the effectual consummation of the program undertaken by such Commission working in close collaboration with our Bishop.

Dean Sweet introduced Resolution No. 13, which was adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 13.

RESOLVED, That this Convention records our appreciation of the Religious Canvass now being undertaken by the Church Federation of St. Louis, and urges our Churches to co-operate, so far as possible, both by supplying volunteers and by financial assistance.

Mr. Manson M. Brien presented his report as Historiographer, which was received and filed.

The Rev. Mr. Nugent, Chairman of the Committee on Constitution and Canons, reported that his Committee had unanimously approved Resolution No. 3, which was adopted by the unanimous vote of each Order, voting separately.

The Rev. Dr. Block, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented the following report:

The Rev. J. J. Wilkins, the Rev. Stephen F. Bayne, Jr., Mr. P. Taylor Bryan, Jr., Mr. A. G. Douglass, Mr. Gustave C. Meisenbach.

Committee on the State of the Church:

The Very Rev. Sidney E. Sweet, the Rev. Karl M. Block, the Rev. Robert O. Kevin, the Rev. J. Manly Cobb, Mr. Ethan A. H. Shepley, Mr. J. K. Stribling, Mr. C. D. Blake and Mr. John D'Arcy.

The Bishop filed a notice for the record that St. Peter's Mission, Canton, St. Paul's Mission, Fredericktown, Christ Church Mission, Moberly, and Trinity Mission, Salem, have become de-organized and ceased to function within the meaning of Section 5, Canon 8, and, therefore, have been removed from the list of organized missions.

A notice from the Secretary of the House of Deputies of the General Convention was filed with the Secretary. (Appendix 13.)

Resolutions Nos. 14, 15, 16, 17 and 18 in the Report of the Department of Christian Social Service were adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 14.

WHEREAS, the Department of Social Service has taken note of the 10-year fight against usurious lenders which has been waged by the Better Business Bureau of St. Louis, and

WHEREAS, the active cooperation of the State government has now been enlisted in prosecuting the so-called "loan sharks," and bringing about a juster situation for the poor man in his necessity, and

WHEREAS, this campaign depends for its success largely on the willingness of citizens, and especially employers, to work with and support the state's campaign, Be It Hereby

RESOLVED, That the Diocese of Missouri thankfully recognizes the work of the Better Business Bureau in laying the groundwork for the present campaign against usurious lenders, and heartily endorses the campaign, and urges upon its people their warmest support, and be it further

RESOLVED, That we call to the attention of our people the opportunities to cooperate in this fight; 1., as employers, by refusing to aid the loan sharks by failing to stand back of unfortunate employees who are their victims,

2., by aiding, where we can, in appeals from judgments given in lower courts in those cases where clearly an injustice is being wrought, and

3., by encouraging, where practicable, in necessitous cases, resort to Credit Unions or the patronage of legitimate small-loan agencies.

Resolution No. 15.

WHEREAS, the past year has witnessed the establishment of the work of the City Mission on a wider and more helpful basis, by the inauguration of the Social Service Department of the Mission, and

WHEREAS, the support of that work has come from the City Mission Society, be it hereby

RESOLVED, That this Convention endorses the work of the City Mission Society in grateful acknowledgement of the contribution of the past year, and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Convention urges upon the members of the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese the obligation to the strongest possible support of the Society, in presenting and hearing its program, and in asking and giving financial aid.

Resolution No. 16.

WHEREAS, the social ministry of the Church in this Diocese and elsewhere can only be effectively done through the active cooperation of the Clergy and Laity in their several Parishes and Missions, and

WHEREAS, one of the most efficient means to gain such mutual cooperation is through the establishment in each Parish and Mission of an active Social Service Committee, be it hereby

RESOLVED, That this Convention urges upon each of its Parishes and Missions that they establish such Social Service Committees, enlisting their best support for those groups, and encouraging the closest cooperation with other Parishes and with the Diocesan programs.

Resolution No. 17.

WHEREAS, Federal, State, and local departments of health, and medical societies are currently waging an intensive campaign against the venereal diseases, which are among the most serious and prevalent of communicable diseases, which campaign has been endorsed by the General Convention of this Church with the recommendation that all possible local action and support be given in its aid, and,

WHEREAS, the present municipal clinic in St. Louis for the treatment of venereal diseases is seriously inadequate to deal with the problem as it should be dealt with, particularly on these counts:

1. Insufficient personnel to give adequate treatment, and the necessary social service, follow-up and epidemiological work,
2. Inadequate records and files for statistical use,
3. Failure to assist in providing medical students and internes with training in the diagnosis and treatment of venereal diseases, and
4. Failure to provide adequate consulting service with specialists and coordination with hospital service so necessary in treatment of venereal diseases, and

WHEREAS, the venereal diseases cost the citizens of the St. Louis Metropolitan area well over two million dollars per annum, which cost can surely be reduced by proper and adequate treatment accessible to all, and

WHEREAS, the present ordinance No. 137, to provide such adequate facilities for the treatment of venereal diseases has so far failed of approval by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, apparently because of the additional appropriation of twenty thousand dollars per annum which the ordinance will require, be it

RESOLVED, That the Diocese of Missouri, in Convention assembled, does hereby endorse this campaign against venereal diseases, following the lead given by the General Convention of this Church, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Diocese of Missouri, in Convention assembled, urges upon the proper authorities in every community that the utmost support be given this campaign, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Diocese of Missouri, in Convention assembled, urges upon the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, and upon the Aldermen of St. Louis the immediate passage of Ordinance No. 137, and the appropriation of the necessary funds to establish adequate free clinical service for the diagnosis and treatment of the venereal diseases under the terms of this ordinance, and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution be mailed to the metropolitan newspapers, the members of the Board of Aldermen, and to the Mayor and the other members of the Board of Estimate and Apportionment of the City of St. Louis.

Resolution No. 18.

WHEREAS, a moral obligation is entailed upon the members of the Clergy of this Church to ascertain surely that persons whose marriages they witness are free from any venereal diseases, and,

WHEREAS, no general discharge of this obligation is possible where the State laws do not demand such examination, and,

WHEREAS, the General Convention of 1937 has recommended that the Convention of the several Dioceses shall urge the Legislatures of their respective States to pass laws requiring that before a marriage license can be issued both the man and the woman applying shall have presented to the proper civil authority duly certified negative reports for syphilis and gonorrhoea from such microscopic and blood tests as shall be at that time approved by the recognized public health authorities, be it hereby

RESOLVED, That the Diocese of Missouri, in Convention assembled, does urge upon the Legislature of this State the passage of the bill to amend Article 1, Chapter 19 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, by adding a new section to be known as Section 2977-A, which proposed amendment, sponsored by the Woman's Chamber of Commerce of this State, and approved by State Commissioner of Public Health, the Executive Secretary of the State Medical Society, and the Surgeon-general of the United States Public Health Service, meets the requirements of the General Convention, and provides for a much-needed service to the people of this State, and be it further

RESOLVED, That this endorsement of this proposed legislation be made known to the metropolitan newspapers, and to the State Public Health Authorities, and to the Governor of the State, without delay.

The Rev. Father Bayne introduced Resolution No. 19, which was adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 19.

WHEREAS, the recent public health survey of the United States Health Survey revealed shocking conditions among the poor families of the nation, and especially among families on relief in their several communities, notably establishing the fact that 30% of cases of disabling diseases among relief families received no medical care, and that the infant mortality rate among the poorest families was over five times as large as the rate among families with incomes of \$3,000 and over, and,

WHEREAS, the inadequate standards of public relief in many communities, and particularly in St. Louis are helping to create an even more serious public health problem among our citizens, and,

WHEREAS, the Bar Association of St. Louis has notably shown the way to an enlarged and thoughtful public service in their voluntary help in the campaign against usurious lenders, be it hereby

RESOLVED, That the Diocese of Missouri, in Convention assembled, calls to the attention of the Medical Societies in St. Louis, and elsewhere in the Diocese, these wretched conditions, and proposes to the members of the medical profession that a suitable survey be made of local public health conditions, in the light of this national report, and that adequate recommendations be made to alleviate these conditions, and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be mailed to the Medical Society in Saint Louis, and to the metropolitan newspapers.

The Rev. Father Bayne introduced Resolution No. 20, which was adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 20.

WHEREAS, the National Child Labor Conference has published figures which represent Missouri as the State having the heaviest burden of child labor, and,

WHEREAS, the public and religious press has carried repeated charges that there is widespread and systematic violation of the Missouri Child Labor Law, especially in the tiff-mine area, be it hereby

RESOLVED, That the Diocese of Missouri, in Convention assembled, calls these figures and charges to the attention of the Governor and the Legislature of this state, and asks that an adequate survey be made by a disinterested body to be selected by the Governor and the Legislature on the basis of these figures and charges, and a public report be made, without delay, and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be mailed to the metropolitan newspapers and to the Governor of the State.

Dean Sweet introduced Resolution No. 21, which was adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 21.

RESOLVED, That this Convention expresses its sincere appreciation of the excellent work done by the Rev. Dr. Kevin and the Rev. Mr. Poindexter and others, in the publication of the Foreword, and assures them that it considers the Foreword of great value to the Diocese and intends to co-operate with them to the fullest extent possible.

Dean Sweet introduced Resolution No. 22, which was adopted, as follows:

Resolution No. 22.

WHEREAS, there are many families on relief in the City of St. Louis, either being evicted daily or in fear thereof, because of the policy of the Relief Administration in paying no rent for relief clients, and

WHEREAS, there are many persons on relief now unable to secure the diet necessary for health, although such diet has been prescribed by the physicians at the City Hospital Clinic, and

WHEREAS, the amount of relief for food which is now being given is woefully inadequate, and according to hospital reports is causing increased sickness among families on relief due to malnutrition and undernourishment, which are modern names for slow starvation, and

WHEREAS, there are also other evidences of the inadequacy of relief in St. Louis,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Protestant Episcopal Church of the Diocese of Missouri in convention assembled records its insistence that the Mayor of St. Louis, the Governor of Missouri, and the State Social Security Commission formulate and put into operation some more adequate policy of relief, and bring to an end the cruel and inhuman procedure which is now producing such great suffering.

It was ordered that copies of Resolutions No. 11 and 22 be sent to the Mayor, the Governor of Missouri and the metropolitan newspapers.

The Secretary was instructed to send a letter of sympathy to the Rev. Dr. Wilkins, who is ill in St. Luke's Hospital.

It was ordered that a Committee be appointed to prepare a memorial to the late Mrs. Sarah K. White for publication in the Journal.

After a prayer and benediction by the Bishop, the Convention adjourned, *sine die*.

In Memoriam

Mrs. Sarah Katherine White

Mrs. Sarah Katherine White (nee Foote) was born April 5, 1852, in the State of New York. On April 22, 1870, she married Abel Wheeler White, who died several years later. She came to St. Louis in 1899, and after the death of her sister, Mrs. Tuttle, she continued to live in the home of our late Bishop, Daniel S. Tuttle.

Mrs. White was a woman remarkable for her rich background both of culture and Church connections, having a personal graciousness of life and a deep consecration that made her influence always uplifting and her personality delightful. For many years she was the presiding spirit and hers was the directing hand of the Bishop's home.

But her influence extended far beyond the home and pervaded the Church in the Diocese. Her acquaintance was wide and her friendship always comforting and strengthening. Her contacts with the life of the Diocese were wide and quiet and deep. She rendered a notable service to the Woman's Auxiliary and to the Girls' Friendly Society and was an unfailing attendant and a devoted worker in the life of the Cathedral Church.

Among many other of her beautiful works was her thoughtfulness concerning the sick and suffering whom she never forgot, and upon whom she often waited in her visitations to St. Luke's Hospital or in the deeper privacy of individual homes.

Mrs. White passed away September 15, 1937. Her going from among us into the Paradise of God leaves a vacancy which it will be difficult to supply.

The General Convention

*To the Ecclesiastical Authorities of the Church
and to the Diocesan Secretaries.*

In compliance with the requirements of Canon 49, Section I. [iv.] notice is hereby given to the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Church in every Diocese and Missionary District, as well as to the Secretary of the Convention of every Diocese, that the following alterations of the Constitution, proposed in the Convention of 1937, are to be finally acted upon in the General Convention of 1940, in accordance with Article XI. of the Constitution.

Furthermore, each Diocesan Secretary is hereby notified that it is his duty to make known such proposed alterations of the Constitution to the Convention of his Diocese at its next meeting, and to certify to the Secretary of the House of Deputies that such action has been taken by him.

AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION PROPOSED AT THE GENERAL CONVENTION OF 1937, AND TO BE FINALLY ACTED UPON AT THE CONVENTION OF 1940.

Resolved, That the following change be made in the Constitution, and that the proposed alteration be made known to the several Dioceses, in order that the same may be adopted by the next General Convention in accordance with Article XI. of the Constitution:

Amend Article XI, of the Constitution by adding in the fifth line after the word "Diocese" the words "and the Convention of every Missionary District within the boundaries of the United States."

And in the sixth line after the word "Convention" add the words "or the Missionary District Convocation."

And in the eleventh line after the word "Dioceses" add the words "and of all the Missionary Districts within the boundaries of the United States."

So that the Article, as amended, shall read:

Article XI. "No alteration or amendment of this Constitution shall be made unless the same shall be first proposed at one triennial meeting of the General Convention and by a resolve thereof be sent to the Secretary of the Convention of every Diocese and of the Convocation of every Missionary District within the boundaries of the United States, to be made known to the Diocesan Convention or the Missionary District Convocation at its next meeting, and be adopted by the General Convention at its next succeeding triennial meeting by a majority of all Bishops, excluding retired Bishops not present, of the whole number of Bishops entitled to vote in the House of Bishops, and by a majority of the Clerical and Lay Deputies of all the Dioceses and of all the Missionary Districts within the boundaries of the United States entitled to representation in the House of Deputies voting by orders."

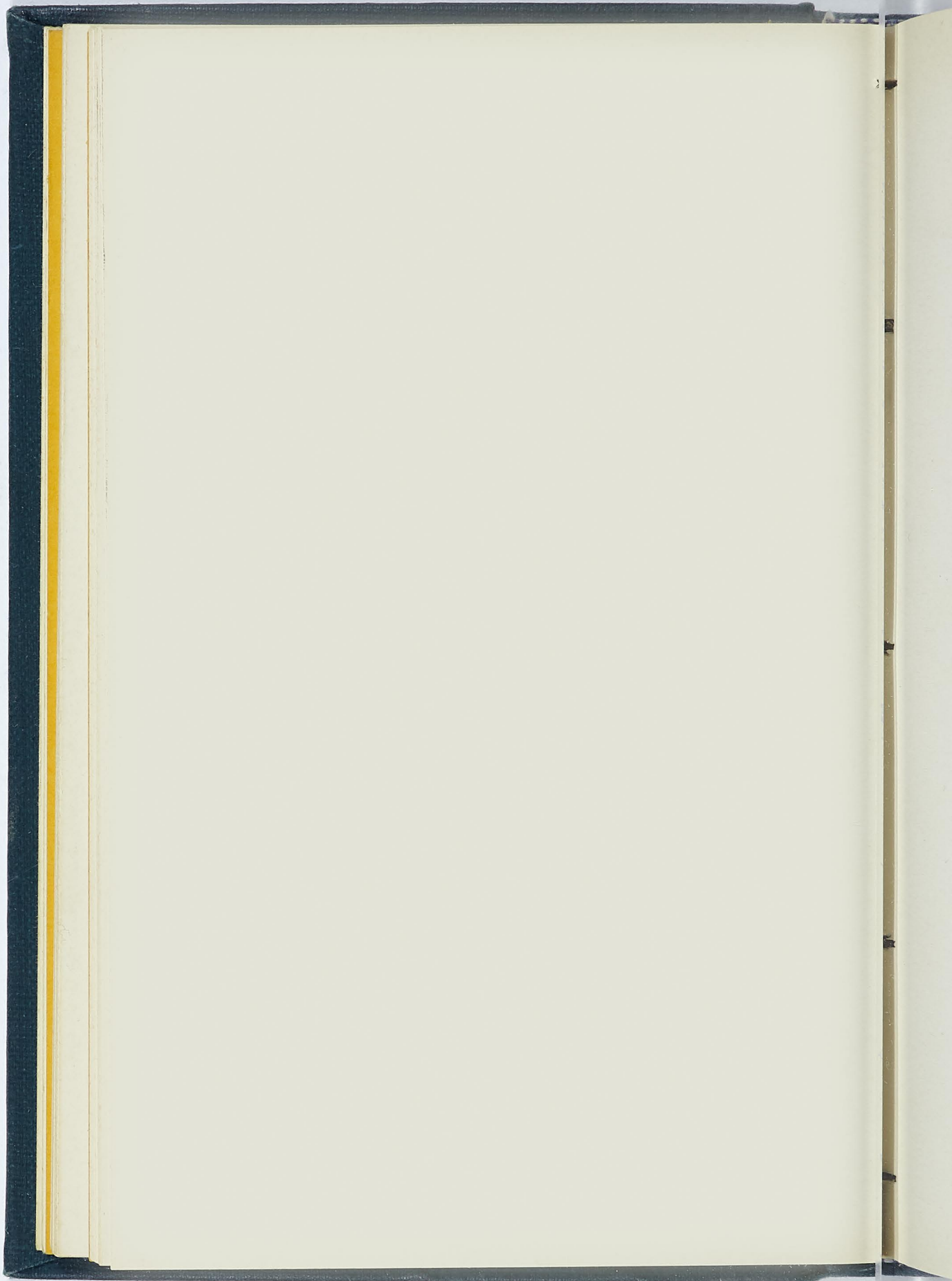

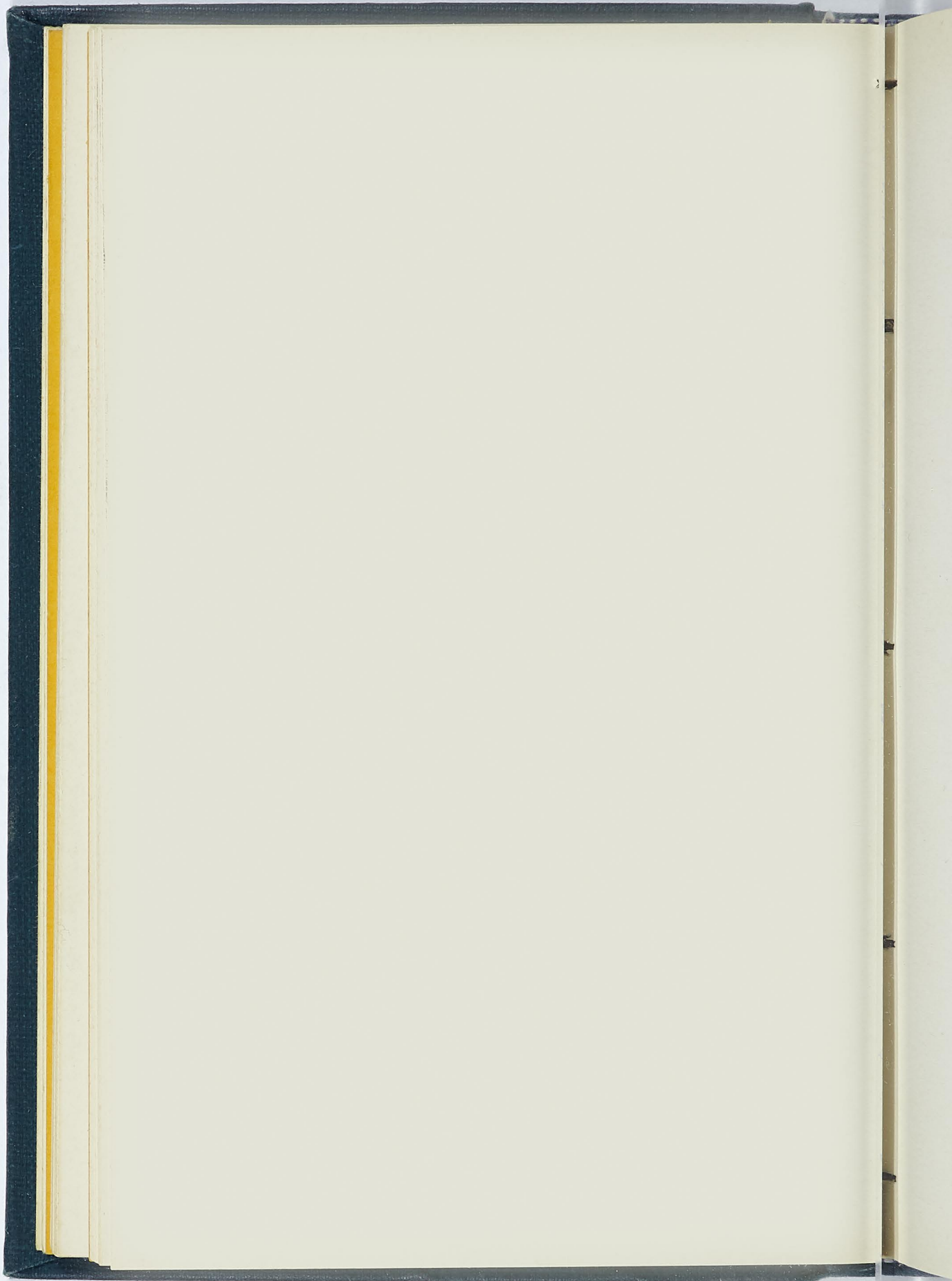
